prof. dr. Velimir Šećerov na Fakulteti za geografijo Univerze v Beogradu poučuje na učiteljskem mestu od leta 2008. Leta 2017 je pridobil naziv rednega profesorja za področje prostorskega načrtovanja. Bil je že gostujoči predavatelj na Univerzi v Banjaluki - PMF (2008-12). Predaval je na univerzah na Dunaju, v Düsseldorfu in Bratislavi, na drugih fakultetah Univerze v Beogradu, strokovnih ustanovah, strokovnih združenjih in mednarodnih organizacijah. Dvakrat je bil član sveta Geografske fakultete. Prav tako je opravljal funkcijo prodekana za finance.

Med letoma 2006/07 je bil sekretar Komisije za razvoj učnih načrtov na matični fakulteti. Poleg ostalega pedagoškega dela je tudi mentor in član komisije za zagovor doktorskih disertacij na domači fakulteti in na drugih fakultetah Univerze v Beogradu, Novem Sadu in Sarajevu.

V svoji karieri je sodeloval pri več mednarodnih projektih (ESTIA, Iron Gate, EUROMONTANA, UN HABITAT - SIRP, ERASMUS, Industrial Culture 2.0 itd.), Kot tudi domačih, v treh ciklih in projektih Ministrstva za znanost Republike Srbije; Je predstavnik fakultete v mreži znanstvenih ustanov Space.net, ki se ukvarjajo s prostorskim in urbanističnim načrtovanjem. Je uradni zastopnik Univerze v Beogradu za sodelovanje s Tehniško univerzo na Dunaju (TUW). V letih 2005/08 je bil nacionalni strokovnjak OZN (program UN HABITAT - SIRP). Večkrat je bil koordinator in predsednik znanstvenih in organizacijskih odborov mednarodnih in domačih znanstveno-strokovnih konferenc ter moderator ali plenarni govornik zasedanj in konferenc.

Je eden izmed ustanoviteljev in v letih 2000/04 predsednik Združenja prostorskih načrtovalcev Srbije in član predsedstva Združenja urbanistov Srbije. Poleg tega je član številnih drugih domačih in tujih strokovnih organizacij (SGD, IKS, EUROMONTANA, Rusko geografsko združenje).

Belgrade Waterfront megaproject / Beograd na vodi

The dynamic development of Belgrade is largely based on its relationship towards the rivers beside which it was built. The right banks of the Danube and Sava Rivers have been developed over many years as the old urban part of the city, while on the left side the new city grew after World War II. Since the twenties of the 20th century, Belgrade has been trying to land on the rivers, through the ideas in a number of plans, studies and competitions. General urban plan of 1923 gave an initial idea; in the period from 1945 to 1990 they were modified in a specific way, typical for that time; in 1996, the idea of EUROPOLIS did not find its materialization, while as of 2012, a new megaproject Belgrade Waterfront has been promoted. It is the latest in a series of capital projects in the city, after The Inner Ring Road Project, New Bridge over the River Sava project, as well as Beko factory plan, Ada Huja (right Danube coast), new city block Stepa Stepanovic, etc. that has caused the most attention among experts and citizens. This ambitiously designed idea should, according to the Republic and City administration, to the next 15 years bring the City investments worth more than 3 billion dollars and create about 13,000 new jobs, covering area of 177 hectares. The new development would feature a million square meters of luxury apartments for 17,000 people, 750,000 square meters of office and commercial space, with five-star hotels, a wall of skyscrapers that will feature the tallest building in Southeastern Europe, an opera house, and the largest shopping mall. From its beginning, this project has been controversial, from complete denial to delight. The area where it will be implemented is in an excellent location in the heart of the city, on the bank of the river Sava. So far this has been the city depot for railroad tracks, with undeveloped coastline and more ruined buildings, but also with buildings occupied by catering facilities, a newly established meeting place of young people and artists, alternative art scene and others. Initially, the construction was preceded by changes of existing General urban plan (master plan), spatial plan for special purpose, changes in law, the declaration of public interest, breakthrough marketing ideas and investors. This lecture aims to show the development of Belgrade on the banks of the rivers from the early 20th century to the present, ie genesis of the idea of the city approach to the river banks, as well as the project Belgrade Waterfront, as the latest challenge to the long-term developmental consequences.
